The Town of Berthoud is providing information regarding the cash lease of town-owned properties for the purposes of agriculture and farming. The Town has seven properties potentially available for lease which are estimated at 287 acres in total. Four of those properties, Numbers 1, 2, 4, and 5 as identified on the farm lease map (available in bid packet) have access to irrigation from the Town of Berthoud. It will be the responsibility of the successful bidder to provide the means and cost (i.e.-pump or pipes) to get the water from the source to the property as the Town will supply the irrigation water only. The Town is calling these four properties that will have irrigation provided as Richardson, Waggener, Kneival east and Kneival west, respectively. The Town is not providing any equipment needed to farm the properties or rental equipment in the event of non-working equipment or pumps. It is solely the responsibility of the bidder to manage the property and incur any expense needed to manage a crop on the land.

It is the Town's position that the winning bidder will sign an annual lease agreement with terms of payment and length of contract with the Town. The Town will give priority to bidders who are able to lease all the properties but will also consider individual agreements for each property on a secondary basis. Bids should be in an overall average price per acre for all of the properties or each property individually. The price per acre will be totaled and divided into monthly installments. Lease payment terms will be made directly to the Town monthly or such a period worked out in the agreement.
